

NOTE: This poll is based on 68 full or partially completed surveys of a random selection of Bowdoin faculty between March 6 and March 23, 2017. An initial sample of 100 current Bowdoin faculty received the survey. The survey was distributed via email using the Qualtrics software system. Results are not weighted. In a sample of this size, one can say with a 95 percent certainty that the results have a statistical precision of plus or minus 10.1 percent of what they would have been had the entire Bowdoin faculty been surveyed.

As with all surveys and polls, one should be cautious in drawing too many strong inferences about Bowdoin faculty attitudes and opinions. Inferences from data like these assume a representative sample and unbiased instruments. Moreover, research has indicated that salient external events can influence the way survey respondents answer certain questions. In designing this survey, we have worked to minimize bias in sample selection and question wording/order, but we must make assumptions that respondents answer truthfully and/or understand the intention of the questions.





Using the open-ended responses, commonly used words are displayed below, with more regularly linked words connected with thicker or thinner gray lines.











Which party controls the majority of seats in the U.S. Senate?





Who is currently the Secretary of State?








