
## Report on Poll about Student Referendum

# Administered by Professor Michael Franz and students in Gov 2080 (Quantitative Analysis of Political Science)


NOTE: This poll is based on 202 full or partially completed surveys of a random selection of Bowdoin students between May 5 and 7, 2024. An initial sample of 700 enrolled Bowdoin students were eligible to receive the survey. The survey was distributed via email using the Qualtrics software system. Results are not weighted.

#### What year are you?





Dear Student Body,

We write to you to report the results of the "Bowdoin Solidarity Referendum" initiated by Bowdoin SJP.

In total, 1366 students voted, which totals 69.55% of enrolled students at our college. **913** (66.84%) students voted "Yes; I support this referendum" and **452** (33.09%) students voted "No; I don't support this referendum." 1 (0.07%) student spoiled their ballot.

The referendum successfully achieved the required supermajority of 66.66% for passage, with a margin of 0.18% and has been conducted in accordance with our outlined policies.

We thank you for your participation in this referendum process and continue to encourage thoughtful activism and respectful dialogue. We also acknowledge the diverse viewpoints around the issues raised, and we remind you of the expectation that all students follow our community values and conduct themselves in accordance with Bowdoin's Social Honor Code.




#### **Histogram of Support for First Provision**

#### Should Bowdoin Issue Statement on Gaza?




#### **Histogram of Support for Second Provision**



Note: Between February 4 and 26, 2024, students in GOV 2080 conducted a separate poll asking a series of questions about campus issues. The data consist of 264 full or partially completed surveys of a random selection of Bowdoin students. The same sample of 700 enrolled Bowdoin students received this initial survey.

The survey was distributed via email using the Qualtrics software system, which allows for an anonymous match between responses collected in February and responses to the follow-up collected in May.

#### **February Results**


Generally speaking, on a scale of 0-100, with 0 being very liberal and 100 being very conservative, where would you place:




